CUPE Nova Scotia is seeking nominations for individuals or locals that have promoted literacy within their union, workplace and or community. There are two awards available annually: one for an individual member and one for a Local Union.

If you know a CUPE member or Local Union that champions workplace literacy programs please consider nominating them for this award. Nominations must be in by **April 15th, 2023**. CUPE Nova Scotia will present its Annual Provincial Literacy Award for an <u>individual</u> and <u>Local Union</u> at the 2022 Provincial Convention.

<u>Award Criteria</u>: Nominees must have actively promoted literacy programs within CUPE, and or their workplace and or their community and championed clear language by:

- * Raising awareness on literacy and clear language within the Union and workplace.
- ***** Help build the Union through literacy and clear language.
- Helped or led the development of a literacy program within their union/local or workplace or they may have promoted worker education in some other way.
- The Local Union must have participated in a literacy program and helped build a Unioncentred education program in the workplace, or they may have promoted worker education in some other way.
- ***** Must be a member in Good Standing of a local affliated to CUPE Nova Scotia.

Decisions of the CUPE Nova Scotia Awards Committee will be final. CUPE Nova Scotia assumes no responsibility for applications that are lost, misdirected, or otherwise not received by the deadline. Late submissions will not be considered.

Remember to clearly communicate in approximately one hundred (100) words why you feel the CUPE Member or local are a literacy champion.
