CUPE Nova Scotia are seeking nominations for individuals or locals that promote literacy within their union, workplace and or community. There are two awards available annually: one for an individual member and one for a Local Union.

If you know a CUPE member or Local Union that champions workplace literacy Programs. Get your nomination in by **March 15th, 2019** as CUPE Nova Scotia will present its 15th Annual Provincial Literacy Award for an <u>individual</u> and <u>Local Union</u> at the 2019 Provincial Convention.

<u>Award Criteria</u>: Nominees must have actively promoted literacy programs within CUPE, and or their workplace and or their community and championed clear language by:

- encouraging other CUPE members to learn.
- model lifelong learning by following their own learning tools.
- raise awareness on literacy and clear language within the Union and workplace.
- help build the Union through literacy and clear language.
- helped or led the development of a literacy program within their union/local or workplace or they may have promoted worker education in some other way.
- The Local Union must have participated in a literacy program and helped build a Unioncentred education program in the workplace, or they may have promoted worker education in some other way.

Decisions of the CUPE Nova Scotia Awards Committee will be final. CUPE Nova Scotia assumes no responsibility for applications that are lost, misdirected, or otherwise not received by the deadline. Late submissions will not be considered.
