COMBATTING HARASSMENT, BULLYING, AND VIOLENCE AT WORK AND IN THE UNION.

Program 2:

LEADERSHIP ESSENTIALS, ESSENTIALS FOR INCLUSIVE UNIONS, BY-LAW ESSENTAILS AND PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURES

Who am I as a leader? Who are we as a local union? How do we fit into the broader movement? Learn how to use the power of your elected position to build power and strengthen solidarity in the union, in the labour movement and in our communities.

Good bylaws are an essential component of a well-functioning local. In this workshop, participants will learn the principals of good bylaws and how to make sure the bylaws are in compliance with CUPE's national constitution. We'll also look at how clear language bylaws help our members get involved in the work of the union.

And, acquire the nitty-gritty of parliamentary procedures: the rules of order when chairing union meetings. Learn about the role of the chair and the different elements (motions, amendments, points of order, etc.). Get a chance to put the learning into practice.

Program 3:

BARGAINING SOLIDARITY

This workshop uses an intensive roleplay to help union activists develop the skills they need to build and maintain solidarity throughout the bargaining process.

Discussions include analyzing internal and external forces that influence collective bargaining, identifying effective strategies and tactics for engaging members, and thinking about ways to reach marginalized members.
